ACCESS

BY AIR: Jomo Kenyatta International Airport is 40 minutes to 1½ hour drive depending on traffic. Nairobi Wilson Airport is closest to Giraffe Manor, a short 20-minute drive outside of rush hour. Giraffe Manor can provide one of their vehicles to transfer you to / from the airport. (Included in the rate)

Giving Back

The Safari Collection is heavily focused on sustainability and giving back, it is at the heart of everything they do. Their ethos is to be low impact, community and conservation orientated to the core and to have a significant positive influence on the people and environment around each lodge.

ROTHSCHILD'S GIRAFFE CONSERVATION AND BREEDING - Giraffe Manor was originally built as a home by David Duncan in the 1930s, and in 1974 Jock and Betty Leslie-Melville purchased the property and started a campaign to save the endangered Rothschild's giraffe. The legacy of their efforts lives on today, with the resident giraffe of Giraffe Manor providing many of the offspring who have gone on to live in the wild and breed the population up. Since the project started, Rothschild's giraffe numbers in the wild have risen from around 100 to around 1,800.



AFRICAN FUND for ENDANGERED WILDLIFE (AFEW) – For each guest that stays at Giraffe Manor, The Safari Collection makes a donation to AFEW and their wildlife conservation projects across Kenya.

GIRAFFE SPONSORSHIP - It is little-known that giraffes are becoming highly endangered in much of the range across Africa. Join the Giraffe Manor giraffe sponsorship programme and contribute to the conservation of these gentle giants.

ONE HORIZON – The Safari Collection supports this charity running feeding programmes, schools and women's centres in some of the slum areas of Nairobi. Guests are able to take part in these programmes if they would like to.
